## **MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The admission of children to the exhibition of any film is restricted by age classification awarded to the film by the British Board of Film Classification.

Where-

the film classification is not specified admission of children must be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the licensing authority.

- "children" means under 18.

- (1) Where individuals are at the premises to carry out a security activity such as door supervision, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- (2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:
  - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph (8)(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licence authorising only plays or films), or
  - (b) in respect of premises in relation to-
    - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
    - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section:
  - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2 (1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
  - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

## **CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE**

The types of regulated entertainment proposed materially do no more than re-instate the normal pub entertainment that were previously unregulated. No new steps have been identified by risk assessment in relation to the four licensing objectives except as below.

No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any times when the premises are open to the public.

Where CCTV is installed with recording facilities such recordings shall be retained for a period of 30 days and made available to the police upon request within a reasonable amount of time

Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for the consumption in any external area provided for the purpose.

To comply with the reasonable requirements of the fire officer from time to time

To comply with the reasonable requests from the Building Control Officer

Where appropriate, prominent, clear and legible signs shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises quietly

Noise and vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties

The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply no unusual risks or harm to children have been identified. Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter the premises after 2100.

Licensed activities are permitted as follows; Until 0000 following each Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of Bank Holiday weekends – (Easter, Spring Bank/Whitsun,) May Day and August Bank holiday) Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and from the commencement of New Years Eve hours until the terminal hour on New Years Day.

Licensable activities are also authorised in the event of a broadcast of televised sporting events of national or international interest outside normal operating hours such closing times for this purpose to be confirmed upon 7 days prior notice in writing to the police and licensing authority to include opening times and the sporting event which is to be shown.

Sale of alcohol is permitted to bona fide residents and their guests. Private entertainment is authorised. The licence acknowledges the external area for consumption and the AWP presently under permit.
