### **MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition permitted hours means-

- a) on weekdays, other than Christmas Day, 08.00 – 23.00,
- b) on Sundays other than Christmas Day 10.00 – 22.30,
- c) on Christmas Day 12.00 – 15.00 and 19.00 – 22.30,
- d) on Good Friday 08.00 – 22.30.

The above restrictions do not prohibit-

- a) during the first 20 minutes after the above hours, the taking of alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in open containers,
- b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises or the despatch by the vendor of alcohol so ordered,
- c) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces,
- d) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club.

Alcohol may only be served for consumption off the premises.

I would continue to only sell alcohol to persons over the age of 18 and to people that are not deemed to be under the influence of alcohol

**a) General – all four licensing objectives (a,b,c,d,e,)**

I would continue to only sell alcohol to persons over the age of 18 and to people that are not deemed to be under the influence of alcohol. Demand for alcohol in the mornings are mainly from people who have just finished a night shift, not from people who are likely to drink in the streets to cause nuisance.

**b) The Prevention of Crime and disorder.**

CCTV is already installed, records all instances that occur on the premises.

**c) Public safety.**

If anyone appears to look under the 18 and without ID they will be refused the purchase and it will be logged in the Refusal Register.

**d) The prevention of public nuisance**

I will continue to liaise with the Police and support new ideas to prevent public nuisance, such as Bottle Watch, where stickers are put on the alcohol to determine which shop it was purchased from.

**e) The protection of children from harm**

Signage is used already on the premises to show that purchasing alcohol for a person under the age of 18 is illegal. A refusal register is available of attempts to purchase alcohol that have been refused.
