MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence:

a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or,

b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3.—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorize anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

6.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

7. The responsible person shall ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

- a) **General - all four licensing objectives (a, b, c, d, e) - Centre managed by 2 designated members of the parish council who will be subject to current health and safety training. Doors kept shut during any performance to reduce noise to outside, will ensure maximum capacity is not exceeded.**
- b) **The prevention of crime and disorder - Intruder alarm and security lighting indoor and outdoor maintained. Number of key holders restricted, names and addresses listed. Entrance to events monitored by door security.**
- c) **Public safety - All events will start with instructions on how to leave building safety in case of fire. The contact details of two responsible people in an emergency. Fire, Police and Ambulance details prominently displayed, extinguishers maintained regularly. Current hygiene standards maintained, disability access at all times, fire doors kept shut.**
- d) **The prevention of public nuisance - Noise levels at events monitored special car parking arrangements made with local school when necessary. Door security when required. Liaise with neighbours for any special events.**
- e) **The prevention of children from harm - All adults supervising children to have current CRB. Any film shown 12A or over proof of age required and parental consent, no 18 rated films shown, current recommendation on adult supervisor to children adhered to.**
