**Where the licence is time limited the dates:** N/a

**Licensable activities authorised by the licence:** Regulated entertainment by film, live and recorded music, provision of facilities for making music and facilities for dancing; sale of alcohol by retail.

**The times the licence authorises the carrying out of licensable activities:** Film 0900 –2100 daily; live and recorded music and facilities for music and dancing 1200 –0000 daily; alcohol sales 1100 – 0000 daily; exemptions listed overleaf

**The opening hours of the premises:** 0900 – 0030 daily

**MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

**CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE**

a) The main business is the provision of go-karting. There are strict rules to ensure the safety of those participating, including checks as to the consumption of alcohol before driving. Consequently, the sale and consumption of alcohol is intended for post go-karting and for the non participants of go-karting.

b) There are strict rules to ensure the safety of those participating in go-karting and that same ethos will run throughout the premises. Young persons are required to sign in and provide their ages. A policy of challenging all appearing to be under 21 will apply for sales of alcohol. In the main all young people will be accompanied by adults. The consumption of alcohol is very much subsidiary to the main business of go-karting. CCTV cameras will assist prevention of crime and disorder. Appropriate training will be given to those involved in the sale of alcohol.

c) Due to the go-karting there is already a safety culture. The area where the go-karting takes place will be a “no drinking” zone. Drinking alcohol is intended for consumption after go-karting or for those not participating in go-karting. By way of deterrent and prevention, an alcohol detecting device will be utilised if necessary.

Health and safety have already been involved and satisfied as far as the go-karting is concerned

d) The premises are located in farm buildings surrounded by farm land. It is a rural setting and consequently non-residential. Nevertheless there are signs to advise people leaving to do so quietly.

In relation to the noise of the go-karting, environment tests have already been successfully conducted. There for it is not anticipated that anyone will be inconvenienced by the occasional live or recorded music played.

e) As most of the children attending will be doing so for the purpose of karting, they will be subject to strict rules ensured for safety. They will also have “signed in” and included their dates of birth/age. Invariably they will be accompanied by parents or other adults – the location is isolated and not served by public transport, therefore virtually all attending arrive by car. A strict policy of challenging all appearing to be under 21 will apply to sales of alcohol.

For the avoidance of doubt licensable activities are intended to be held in the buildings and the marquee,

Licensable activities are also authorised on no more than 12 occasions in any calendar year until 0100 when written notice is given to the Licensing Authority and the Police. When such occasions are used the premises will be open for a further 30 minutes after the last alcohol sale. By way of example a 21<sup>st</sup> Birthday held in the marquee
