MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence:

a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or,

b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3.—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorize anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

6.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

7. The responsible person shall ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

Where - the film classification is not specified admission of children must be restricted in accordance with the recommendation of the licensing authority. "children" means under 18.

(1) Where individuals are at the premises to carry out security activity such as door supervision, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

(2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed. (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licence authorising only plays or films), or (b) in respect of premises in relation to - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

(3) For the purpose of this section: (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2 (1)(a) of that Schedule applies and (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

The following is a copy of the operating schedule that accompanied the application. General - CCTV surveillance on entry door. Swipe card system access for members and guests. Club management, steward and bar staff are informed of the licensing Act 2003 objectives and statutory requirements to comply with all relevant provisions of the act. Car parking area and rear of the club have PIR floodlights.

Crime and disorder - Club constitution including rules governing the conduct of members and their guests within and adjacent to the club premises. Admission to the club is confined to members and their guests controlled through the door entry system. Also with the premises licence we will allow non-members to enter the club for parties and other functions to purchase alcohol. Guests arriving unaccompanied are scrutinised via CCTV before admission and signed in by a host member. Club employees are instructed not to admit or serve member or guests who behave in a drunk and disorderly manner. Misconduct is reported to the committee to consider action under the clubs disciplinary code.

Public safety - The club complies with health and safety precaution regulations following risk assessment prevention and control measures are in place to ensure safety of members, guests, employees and entertainers while on the premises. The club complies with advised capacity limits. Fire action notices are posted, emergency escape routes are sign posted and covered by emergency lighting. Fire alarm and emergency lights are tested regularly.

Public nuisance - Signage is displayed near exits requesting members and guests to respect the needs of local residents by quietly leaving the premises and the car park. When live or recorded music is played all reasonable steps are taken to avoid disturbance to neighbouring properties.

Harm to children - Persons under the age of 18 are only allowed in the club if accompanied by an adult member. Door control system ensures children seeking admission for any purpose are accompanied by an adult. We actively encourage junior members of 16 years of age to play snooker with an adult. Young adults applying for membership must satisfy the committee that they are over 18, if necessary proof of age will be asked for. Accompanying children may attend a private party in the function room. Committee, club steward and bar staff re-instructed in the offence provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 relating to alcohol and the protection of children. Signage prohibiting the direct or indirect supply and delivery of alcohol to children is displayed. The club rules apply to the operation as a club.
