MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

- a) On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 10.00 hours to 23.00 hours
- b) On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12.00 hours (noon) to 22.30 hours
- c) On Good Friday, 12.00 hours (noon) to 22.30 hours
- d) On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 10.00 hours to 23.00 hours
- e) On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12.00 hours (noon) to 22.30 hours
- f) On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, 00.00 hours (midnight) on 31st December)
- g) On Christmas Day said hours shall be in accordance with the Club rules but
 - 1 not exceed six and a half hours;
 - 2 not begin earlier than 12.00 hours (noon);
 - 3 not end later than 22.30 hours
 - 4 provide for a break of at least 2 hours, including 15.00 hours to 17.00 hours;
 - 5 not extend for more than three and a half hours after 17.00 hours

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied as ancillary to the meals;
- d) the supply to, or consumption by, any person of alcohol in any premises where they are residing.

The Club rules and constitution govern the operation of this Club Premises Certificate.

Any club premises certificate that authorises the supply of alcohol:

- 1) The supply of alcohol must be made when the premises are open for the purposes of supplying alcohol, in accordance with the club certificate, to members of the club for consumption on the premises.
- 2) Any alcohol supplied for consumption off the premises must be in a sealed container.
- 3) Any supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises must be made to a member of the club in person.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE CLUB OPERATING SCHEDULE

Corley Bowling Club is subject to the strict terms of the Lease and also by a conveyance dated 16 May 1952 made between the Reverend Charles Percy Gosling representing the Church Commissioners and the then Trustees of the Corley Village Hall. This Conveyance contains covenants forbidding any activities on site that might become a nuisance and is included in our existing lease. Thus Club social activities are confined to teas on match days in the summer season and infrequent social occasions such as a Gala Day.

Again with reference to Corley Bowling Club's Lease the Club is not permitted to assign or sub-let the premises to any other organisation. This means that the Club premises are only open on match days for members and visiting teams for the purpose of flat rink bowling. During the close winter season the premises are frequented only for green and fabric maintenance, carried out by members themselves as required by the Lease and an occasional social evening.

The Club premises were inspected by Warwickshire Fire and Rescue representatives on 1 October 2003 and pronounced satisfactory. Club fire extinguishers were inspected February 2005 and one new extinguisher purchased. Health and Safety inspect kitchen areas annually and the Club satisfies their conditions. Fire exits and escape routes are clear and maintained satisfactorily.

The Club Lease contains clause 3.10 ensuring that, in addition to restrictions already referred to, Corley Bowling Club may not permit any loudspeaker or similar apparatus to be audible outside of the demised premises and neither to allow any floodlighting such as might cause annoyance to the landlord or neighbours. Sales or auctions are also prohibited. Neither can obtrusive advertising in any form be permitted.

Corley Bowling Club has a clause in its conditions stating Club commitment to promoting a safe environment in which children and vulnerable adults can enjoy participation in bowling. There are two Club members recruited to take responsibility for ensuring the above in accordance with the guide lines issued by the English Bowling Association.
