ASB - Hartshill

Snowhill recreation ground.

- 33 targeted patrols, (excluding issues with fair).
- Continued lower level of ASB, only one incident reported in three months
- Alcohol seized nearby on 3 occasions.
- 5 youths caught playing truant and returned to school.
- 12th Aug, Council and local youths litter picking in the area.

Hartshill Fair update.

- Meeting held prior to event which took place bet 30th Sept and 3rd
 October
- All parties responsibilities clarified and Risk Assessment completed.
- Enhanced Police resources allocated in particular on Fri 2nd Oct.
- No reported incidents of anti-social behaviour received by Police over the 4 day period.

How to address motor vehicle nuisance?

As residents you are more likely to know the names of the people causing problems. We need **you** to identify and provide the local PCSO and Police with the names of the people who are riding motorcycles illegally.

We need you to:

- Report all incidents of motorcycle nuisance to the Police on 01926 415000.
- Name the individuals involved.
- Provide as much information about the bike and the rider as possible

Nuisance motorcycles

Mancetter Rec/Manor Rd/Westwood Rd/Golf Course

- Received a total of 18 calls re off road motor cycles of these 9 were in the area of Westwood Road / Golf Course.
- 38 targeted patrols
- Off Road Motor Cycle Team conducted 3 targeted patrols.arrested one on stolen motor cycle, and issued 2 Sec 59 notices.
- Local staff issued 3 Sec 59 notices.

Two Hartshill Houses Raided.

On Wednesday 19 August and Thursday 20 August 2009 after local intelligence was received, warrants were issued by magistrates to search two addresses in the Hartshill area for drugs. SNT officers from the North and East teams recovered cannabis and cultivation equipment from both properties. The occupants of the addresses, were arrested for cultivation of cannabis and duly processed. • Resources have been identified to enhance patrols for the Holloween and Bonfire period which will include visits to schools highlighting ASB and associated problems. This will focus on the impact this could have, particularly on elderly residents in the community.

• Leaflets/Posters will be distributed in the area for advice.

 Joint patrols have been conducted involving both North Warwickshire and Nuneaton and Bedworth staff to monitor ASB in the Galley Common and Hartshill/Ansley Common areas. This has resulted in a considerable quantity of alcohol being seized.

Number Plate Anti-Tamper Screws

Stealing car number plates seems to be on the up - they are then used on other vehicles to commit further crimes or even shipped abroad. Warwickshire Police can now supply number plate screws for a wide variety of vehicles - free of charge. Once in place, they can't be easily undone without damaging the number plate.

Some more simple steps to protect your vehicle:



- Always lock your car
- Never leave items on display
- If you have a garage, use it
- If possible, remove the stereo and sat nav
- Fit a lockable fuel cap
- Fit locking wheel nuts (particularly useful if you have alloy wheels)
- If parking on a road, try to park on a well lit area
