ASB

- High Street/rear of Polash/Church Hill, Coleshill (Agreed 20 targeted patrols)
- * Nuisance Motor Cycles rear of Sycamore Crescent, Arley

Community Priorities

- Warwickshire Police is obliged to protect communities from harm in line with the 'Police Priorities'.
- This may mean that in exceptional circumstances SNT officers may be required to work on other policing priorities.
- If this happens there will be a need to re-negotiate priorities. This will be done in liaison with the Chair and the panel.

ASB:-new recording system as of 1st April, 2011.

All ASB recorded including nuisance vehicles, neighbour disputes.

ASB - High Street/rear of Polash, Coleshill

- 46 Targeted patrols (target 20)
- Reactive units have been patrolling locations
- Officers have changed shifts to increase patrols of area
- •Details have been taken of young people in the vicinity who have not returned after being warned about behaviour.

 None caught in act of ASB.
- Problem has diminished in locale BUT different youngsters started to congregate in St Philips Court.

Nuisance Motor Cycles – Sycamore Crescent, Arley

- 15 target patrols achieved 40
- •Increase in reported incidents as we have done a letter drop asking people to report offenders but residents say problem has diminished
- •We want this to remain a priority as there is more work to be done
- One S 59 Notice issued
- Offenders spoken to and also those dropping off bikes
- Land Agents/owners spoken to re preventative actions

Watch Schemes

- Business Units on Soul End Farm, Corley Dog Training Centre, L S Court, Keresley Rugby Club, Keresley Cricket Club
- Neighbourhood no new schemes

Other Work

- Crime Prevention Evening on 28 June at Shustoke was successful.
- •The team is settling into the new policing model.
- An Autumn project is planned for Coleshill Primary School, involving the children doing a Road Safety Project and at the last stages working with their parents, to shame them into parking safely.
- Drugs Awareness Talk at Herbert Fowler School
- •Regarding Community Speed Watch in Ansley Vetting forms have been submitted for checks, more volunteers are needed (3 or 4) and a coordinator is still required.

CHANGES FROM MAY 2011 – to reiterate

- WPC 86 Ellen BEATY 'Beat Manager' will be responsible for the day to day Policing of the forum area.
- PCSO's to carry out much the same role as present.
- There will be no SNT responsibility for investigating crimes or attending incidents. Incident response will be provided by teams based at Bedworth and Rugby.
- All investigations will be conducted by investigation teams based at the Criminal Justice Centre (CJC) Nuneaton.
- •8 x 'Harms Teams' across the county 1 x PS & 8 PC's to be allocated specific tasks by SNT's across the county. SNT Beat Managers will put in bids for their services. They will also carry out proactive duties.
