Emergency Tree Preservation Order – Bassetts Pole

1 Summary

1.1 The report seeks confirmation of action taken to make an Emergency Tree Preservation Order

Recommendation to the Board

That the action taken in making this Order be confirmed.

2 Consultation

2.1 Consultation took place with both the Board Chairman and Vice-Chairman before the Order was made.

3 Background

- 3.1 The Council received a Prior Notification application for the demolition of number 99 London Road, south of Bassett's Pole opposite the junction with Withy Hill Road. This is a small detached residence set well back from the road but located within the corner of a large area of woodland. This is a designated Ancient Woodland.
- 3.2 It was unclear from the Notification application if trees within the curtilage were to be removed at the same time as the proposed demolition. As a consequence the Council's Tree Officer was asked to inspect the site and he concluded that the trees within the curtilage were the same species as within the adjoining woodland.
- 3.3 His assessment of the trees was that an Order was justified. The TEMPO form is attached at Appendix A. Importantly the trees were seen as a buffer zone on the edge of the Woodland. Being adjacent to the main London Road there was high public visibility.
- As a consequence he recommended that an Order be made and in view of the Notification application, that it should be done swiftly. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman were both consulted and with neither having an objection, the Order was made under emergency powers. A copy of the Order is attached at Appendix B.

- 3.5 A period of consultation will now take place.
- 3.6 The Prior Notification application was subsequently approved following the service of the Order.
- 4 Report Implications
- 4.1 Finance and Value for Money Implications
- 4.1.1 There is no implication arising from the making of the Order, but Members are aware that in certain circumstances, compensation may be paid if Consent is refused for works to be undertaken to the protected trees.
- 4.2 Links to Council's Priorities
- 4.2.1 The conservation of the Borough's rural heritage is one of its priorities as reflected in the Development Plan.

NORTH WARWICKSHIRE BOROUGH COUNCIL (99 London Road, Bassetts Pole, B75 6JZ) TREE PRESERVATION ORDER 2019

THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE to let you know that on 2nd June 2019 we made the above tree preservation order. A copy of the order is enclosed. In simple terms, no one is allowed to cut down, top or lop without our permission the trees described in the 1st Schedule of the order and shown on the map.

The order came into force, on a temporary basis, on 2nd June 2019, and will remain in force for six months. During this time we will decide whether the order should be given permanent status.

This Order has been made to protect trees described in the 1st Schedule of the Order and shown on the map. A Prior Notification has been presented to North Warwickshire Borough Council ("the council") for the removal of a detached property upon the land and there is a very high potential that a number of the trees within the 1st Schedule are detailed for removal. An inspection was undertaken by the Council's Green Space Officer (Trees). His TEMPO assessments indicate that the trees within this area definitely merit protection. A number of the trees within the area are not within the direct view of the general public but do provide an environmental benefit to the site as a whole. The site is adjacent to an Ancient Woodland and the site and its flora mirror exactly the species represented within the previously mentioned Woodland. The trees are semi-mature to mature in age class; they do add a considerable value to the edge of town environment which is important in terms of public amenity and the setting of the location in general. A high number of the trees fall within the designated buffer zone of the Woodland and their continued presence upon the site will add to the protection afforded to this most important of areas. The Tree Preservation Order is to protect the trees on the land that are noted within the 1st schedule of the order in the interest of public amenity.

People affected by the order have a right to object or make comments on the tree covered before we decide whether the order should be made permanent.

If you would like to make any objections or comments, please make sure we receive them in writing by 8th July 2019.

Your comments must meet regulation 6 of the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation) (England) Regulations 2012 (a copy is attached). Please send your comments to the Solicitor to the

Council at the address detailed below. We will carefully consider all objections and comments before deciding whether to make the order permanent.

We will write to you again when we have made our decision. COPY OF REGULATION 6 OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (TREES PRESERVATION) (ENGLAND) REGULATIONS 2012

Objections and representations

- 6(1) Subject to paragraph (2), objections and representations:
 - (a) shall be made in writing and:
 - (i) delivered to the authority not later than the date specified by them under regulation 5(2)(c); or
 - (ii) sent to the authority in a properly addressed and pre-paid letter posted at such time that, in the ordinary course of post, it would be delivered to them not later than that date;
 - (b) shall specify the particular trees, groups of trees or woodlands (as the case may be) In respect of which the objections or representations are made; and
 - (c) In the case of an objection, shall state the reasons for the objection.
- 6(2) The authority may treat as duly made objections and representations which do not comply with the requirements of paragraph (1) if, in the particular case, they are satisfied that compliance with those requirements could not reasonably have been expected.

Tree Preservation Order, 2019

The North Warwickshire Borough Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 198 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 make the following Order—

Citation

 This Order may be cited as the North Warwickshire Borough Council (Land at 99 London Road, Bassetts Pole, B75 6JZ) Tree Preservation Order, 2019.

Interpretation

- 2.—(1) In this Order "the authority" means the North Warwickshire Borough Council.
- (2) In this Order any reference to a numbered section is a reference to the section so numbered in the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and any reference to a numbered regulation is a reference to the regulation so numbered in the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation)(England) Regulations 2011.

Effect

- 3.—(1) Subject to article 4, this Order takes effect provisionally on the date on which it is made.
- (2) Without prejudice to subsection (7) of section 198 (power to make tree preservation orders) or subsection
 (1) of section 200 (tree preservation orders: Forestry Commissioners) and, subject to the exceptions in regulation
 14, no person shall—
- (a)cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage, or wilfully destroy; or
- (b)cause or permit the cutting down, topping, lopping, wliful damage or wliful destruction of,
- any tree specified in the Schedule to this Order except with the written consent of the authority in accordance with regulations 16 and 17, or of the Secretary of State in accordance with regulation 23, and, where such consent is given subject to conditions, in accordance with those conditions.

Application to trees to be planted pursuant to a condition

4. In relation to any tree identified in the first column of the Schedule by the letter "C", being a tree to be planted pursuant to a condition imposed under paragraph (a) of section 197 (planning permission to include appropriate provision for preservation and planting of trees), this Order takes effect as from the time when the tree is planted.
