Forum Priorities

- Parking issues and obstruction of pavements Grange Road and in the vicinity of The Green, Hartshill
 (25 targeted patrols)
 - ASB Market Square, Atherstone (25 targeted patrols)
 - Speeding along Manor Road, Mancetter (15 targeted patrols)

Community Priorities

- Warwickshire Police is obliged to protect communities from harm in line with the 'Police Priorities'.
- This may mean that in exceptional circumstances SNT officers may be required to work on other policing priorities.
- If this happens there will be a need to re-negotiate priorities.
 This will be done in liaison with the Chair and the panel.

Parking issues and obstruction of pavements Grange Road and in the vicinity of The Green, Hartshill

- 44 targeted patrols completed (25 agreed)
- Engaged with construction site on Grange Road as priority
- All Local residents received letters, majority visited in respect of problem.
- As far as possible, local keepers notified during early stage of tasking prior to prosecution.
- 9 keepers prosecuted in relation to vehicles causing obstruction at the location.

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Market Square, Atherstone

- 96 targeted patrols completed (25 agreed)
- Engaged with all businesses in the Square and Public Houses.
- Engaged with public and market traders
- Engaged with St. Mary's Church regarding youths congregating in alleyway at rear and increased checks at this location
- Engaged with groups regularly using the square.
- Concentrated patrols in the evening.
- Pro-active with licensing issues in and around the square.
- Pro-active with local youths utilising Townwatch and targeting local element

Speeding along Manor Road, Mancetter

- 48 patrols conducted (25 agreed) morning and afternoon
- 342 vehicles checked as per speed gun incentive
- 6 drivers advised for marginal breaches over speed limit
- 16 drivers reported for speeding offences (highest 44mph)
- Successful prosecution of driver for assault on lollipop lady (court)
- 3 other traffic offences dealt with including one for prosecution of cannabis engagement with local residents
- Speed analysis completed by road safety officer at Manor Road

Other Work

Safer Neighbourhoods


- Operation Stevenage targeting of red diesel, scrap metal dealers and illegal vehicles
- Development of Townwatch total of 13 people now banned from all member shops, developed structure
- Strong involvement in offender management system disruption, targeting and support
- Ongoing work between SNT and CID in respect of disorder during Atherstone vs Barrow FA cup match
- Positive action in respect of drug misuse in and around town centre resulting in a number of persons processed for a variety of offences
- Ongoing focus on pubs ensuring that all breaches of licence are dealt with
- Active targeting of local town centre based youths

PC 887 Louise BAXTER

- Current recorded crime levels on target to sustain reductions in 2013/14
- Very recent spike in domestic burglaries
- Working with Neighbourhood Watch to promote security advice and reporting of suspicious activitiy
- See example crime prevention campaigns



- Set a timer switch to turn your lights on when it gets dark – unlit houses are a give away that no one is at home.
- Lock your doors, patios and downstairs windows - even when you are in. Make sure you double check them again before you go to bed.
- If you have a burglar alarm, make sure you set it when you got out and also when you go to bed.
- Don't leave car keys, ID cards or valuables near windows, doors or letterboxes, where burglars can reach through to steal them.
- Lock your garden gates and side entrances.
 Don't leave tools lying around in the garden which could be used to break in to your home.
