Safer Neighbourhood Priorities

- Parking Issues Long Street Atherstone
 (15 targeted patrols)
- Speeding along Coleshill Road, Chapel End (10 targeted patrols)
- Underage Drinking Atherstone town centre (10 targeted patrols)

Community Priorities

• Warwickshire Police is obliged to protect communities from harm in line with the 'Police Priorities'.

• This may mean that in exceptional circumstances SNT officers may be required to work on other policing priorities.

• If this happens there will be a need to re-negotiate priorities. This will be done in liaison with the Chair and the panel.

Parking Issues – Long Street Atherstone

(15 patrols = 100% agreed Policing activity)

- 48 patrols conducted
- 33 fixed penalty notices issued to drivers (total £990 in fines)
- 1 driver reported for summons (court) for parking and associated vehicle offences
- 183 drivers warned regarding parking offences on Long Street

Speeding – Coleshill Road, Chapel End

(10 patrols = 100% agreed Policing activity)

- 29 patrols conducted
- 915 cars checked with speed gun in last 3 months. 1 speeding issue identified
- Speed gun checks conducted at different times, days and locations at Coleshill Road Chapel End
- Liaison with traffic department, Nuneaton Police and Coleshill Police to ensure cross border/area checks
- Work with council highways department to identify any speeding issues
- Establishment of community speedwatch programme for Hartshill/Chapel End

Underage Drinking – Atherstone Town

(10 patrols = 100% agreed Policing activity)

- 43 patrols completed
- Analysis of days, times and locations in the town patrols to reflect this
- Pubs in town visited and challenge 21 policy introduced into all Pubs on Long Street
- Unannounced licensing checks completed in 10 pubs in town centre (police) and further 6 pubs (police & licensing officer)
- Drugs testing during checks 2 pubs tested positive
- Test purchase operation with trading standards 7 pubs tested, 1 sold alcohol to under 18

Other Work

- Continued emphasis on setting up NHW schemes
- Community engagement days delivering crime prevention advice and ensuring engagement with public
- Graffiti clean up day in conjunction with community payback scheme.
- Increased work within local schools.
- Multi-agency meeting to address parking issues Chapel End
- ASB in NW East has reduced by 37.2% in past 3 months when compared with same 3 months in 2010
- Significant Cannabis hydroponics plant located in Atherstone
