
HIGHWAYS STATEMENT OF COMMON GROUND

Land South of Warton Recreation Ground Orton Road, Warton

Appeal Ref: APP/R3705/W/25/3371526

Date: 14th November 2025



1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 This Highways Statement of Common Ground ("HSoCG") has been prepared by Hub Transport Planning Ltd acting on behalf of Richborough ("the Appellant") and has been agreed with North Warwickshire Borough Council ("the Planning Authority") in relation to a non-determination Appeal for an outline planning application for the construction of up to 110 dwellings, with access, landscaping, sustainable drainage features, and associated infrastructure (all matters reserved except for access), on land south of Warton Recreation Ground, Orton Road, Warton.
- 1.2 The Planning Authority formally considered the planning application at its Planning and Development Board meeting on 6th October 2025, and resolved that it would have refused planning permission for five reasons. None of the reasons for refusal (RfR) related strictly to highway safety issues.
- 1.3 There was a single reason for refusal (RfR) relating to transport matters.
- 1.4 RfR 1 related to the proposal being contrary to the Council's spatial planning policy as represented in its settlement hierarchy as defined in the North Warwickshire Local Plan 2021.
- 1.5 RfR1 states that Warton is a Category Four Settlement within that hierarchy and owing to the limited services and facilities within it, the proposal would represent a wholly disproportionate and unsustainable addition to the settlement.
- 1.6 There was no objection to the proposed development from the Highway Authority, subject to conditions and S106 payments as set out in their consultation response dated 26th September 2025.
- 1.7 The purpose of this HSoCG is to set out the transport matters regarding the appeal proposals, to which both parties agree.

2.0 Areas of Agreement

- 2.1 The Appellant and the Planning Authority agree that the following transport issues set out below are not in dispute.
- 2.2 Safe and suitable access can be provided for the Appeal site, subject to the proposed highway works shown on drawings T24529.001 rev H and T24529.002 rev G. Details of the proposed highway works are as follows.
 - Vehicular access with Church Road with traffic-calming scheme and lighting (subject to detailed design, as set out in highway authority condition 4 on their consultation response dated 26/09/25);
 - Pedestrian/cycle access with Church Road, connecting to Warton Recreation Ground and into the centre of the village;
 - Pedestrian/cycle access to Orton Road via a new dropped-kerb crossing to the west of the site onto Church Road
- 2.3 The Appeal site is within walking and cycling distance of facilities within Warton, including a local shop with post office, primary school, public house, church and social club. The Chartered Institute of Highways and Transportation (CIHT) has suggested walking distances to common facilities below:

- 2.4 Polesworth train station is situated around 1.3km to the west of the site as the crow flies. Polesworth has a parliamentary train service of one northbound train a day at 06:48 to Tamworth Train Station.
- 2.5 Tamworth train station is situated around 6.8km to the west of the site as the crow flies. Tamworth provides regular direct services to a significant number of destinations throughout the week, both locally and nationally, including Lichfield, Stafford, Nuneaton, Rugby, Birmingham, Cheltenham Spa, Nottingham, Derby, Cardiff and London
- 2.6 In terms of actual distance Polesworth Station is located around 2.2km, Atherstone Station is located circa 8.0km, Tamworth Station is around 8.3km from the site.
- 2.7 Bus stops are located on Maypole Road, adjacent to Church Road, and are located 625m from the centre of the appeal site. A specific bus service is also provided to The Polesworth School for pupils within Warton. The current bus timetable and route is attached to this SoCG. It is agreed that the existing bus stops along Orton Road are in excess of the recommended 400m maximum distance from the site.

2.8 An assessment of the facilities in Warton was provided in the form of a Settlement Sustainability Appraisal in 2018 and 2023 (CD4.11 and CD 4.12). The Council have recently published a 2025 Settlement Sustainability Appraisal which records the same facilities and services in Warton. The distances to local facilities and services across Warton and Polesworth are as shown in the table below:

- 2.9 The Appeal site will not have a severe adverse impact on the operation of the highway network.
- 2.10 The Appeal site will not have an unacceptable impact on highway safety, subject to the agreed highway works outlined on drawings T24529.001 rev H and T24529.002 rev G.
- 2.11 As part of the Appeal site, Warwickshire County Council (WCC) have requested the following transport contributions to improve modes of sustainable transport, as set out in WCC's consultation response (CD 10.8):
 - A sum of £1,176,000 towards improved walking, cycling and wheeling provision towards Polesworth taking
 the route of P12 as identified in WCCs LCWIP with 50% to be paid upon commencement to allow for
 design works and consultations and the remaining contribution to be paid prior to occupation of 25% of the
 development.
 - A sum of £238,608 towards public transport improvements, to extend the local bus service (785/786) to Ventura Park and operate an additional later journey at 19h25 from Tamworth, Monday to Saturday.
 - A sum of £6,000 towards the cost of a TRO associated with a 30mph reduction on Church Road to be paid on commencement of development.

3.0 Areas of Disagreement

- 3.1 The areas of disagreement remaining on transport issues between the Appellant and Planning Authority are agreed as follows:
 - 1. The nature and extent of the services and facilities in Warton and whether those services are "limited" as described by RfR 1;
 - 2. The nature and extent of sustainable transport modes to and from Warton and whether the future occupants will rely on the private motor vehicle to access services and facilities;
 - 3. The acceptable walking distance to services and facilities;
 - 4. The extent to which the Appeal site would represent an unsustainable addition to the settlement, also as set out in RfR 1;
 - 5. The LPA do not agree that access, pedestrian or vehicular access, can be provided onto Red Marl Way.
